7. ALTERATIONS

Rear addition; rear porch; outside chimney; Greek Revival doorway with pilasters and an entablature.

8. NOTABLE FEATURES over the Overhanging eaves; boxed cornice; 12/12 sash; transom over the front door; large brick chimney; stone foundation; asymmetrical facade.

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

Four windows to the left and two to the right of the doorway give this house an agreeable asymmetry. The small window panes are another feature of this house, which has in important role in the Nut Plains district.

The Nut Plains were so named by the first settlers for the hazel nut trees then abundant there. Achsa Lee is believed to have built this house, which she owned at least until 1852.
