8. NOTABLE FEATURES
Overhanging eaves; 8/8 sash; stone chimney. Interior - triangular chimney; beams are cased and have a leaded edge; summer beam; Guilford corner cupboard; original frame around the cooking fireplace; old dutch oven.

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

An off-center door and fine stone chimney are distinguishing features of this one-and-a-half story plus garret Colonial house. It is a fine example of Guilford's smaller 18th century houses.

Sgt. Reuben Parmelee enlisted in the Revolutionary Army on 10 April 1781. He served eight months, twenty days. It is believed he built this house in 1786. It was owned in 1852 by George Davis.
