7. ALTERATIONS

Siding; side additions; entrance; side fenestration altered; window sash.

8. NOTABLE FEATURES

Asymmetrical window arrangement on the front facade; stone chimney and foundation.

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

If Amos Griswold built this house in 1804, as is thought, he was very conservative in his architectural taste. The lean-to form, five-window facade, especially an asymmetrical one, and central stone chimney are all features that could have been part of houses built many years earlier. Their use here shows the continuing viability of the Colonial form. Those features are attractive aspects of this house, now possessed of a modern entry portico and siding.

Amos Griswold is recorded as still owning this property in 1852. He was a founding member of the Odd Fellows,

Menuncatuck Lodge, No. 62 in 1849.
