Frederick Z. Hart, born 4th February, 1866, the son of Elisha and Sarah Beardsley Hart, was at least a fourth generation resident of Guilford. Hart's father Elisha was a farmer and for 25 years deputy sheriff of New Haven County. Frederick Hart made his career as an engineer on the New York, New Haven and Hartford Railroad.

Hart married Bertha Todd Morris in October 1888. They built this house in 1892 and lived here many years. Hart died in 1947.
