It is three quarters of a mile southeast of the Guilford Green and a quarter of northeast of the Guilford Marina. The area is residential with many homes in the vicinity. A driveway extends p southeast of the Guilford Marina. The area is residential with many homes in the vicinity. A driveway extends p southeast side of the house and ends at a small garage to the rear or northeast side of the house.  **Other notable features of building or site (Interior and/or Exterior)  Built c. 1940, this two story Vernacular style house sits atop a poured concrete foundation and is sheathed in b siding. The side gable roof is covered in architectural shingles with a chimney centered on the ridgeline. Two sone hung sash windows are located on the second floor level under wide eaves. A pair of the same windows a first floor with a door on the southeast side of the facade. All the windows have gray shutters. (See Continuation Architectural Limportance:  Dayton W. Galvin was the first owner of this house in 1940. He was married to Adele Galvin and they had one named Lorraine. Dayton grew up on lower Whitfield Street and lived on High Street before this house was bu worked as an electrician and Adele worked for The Old Guilford Forge Company, a retail shop on the Green the early American reproduction furnishings.
