8. NOTABLE FEATURES

Twin brick chimneys; doorway with a triangular pediment; slender pilasters and a fanlight with decorative lead work; stone slab foundation.

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

The doorway with a fanlight pushing into a triangular pediment is one of the few decorative features of the Dr. Jared Redfield house. The two chimneys indicate a commodious central hall plan inside. A few idiosyncrasies lead one to wonder if parts of the house may have been built at different times; the front door is just slightly off center, and one of the chimneys sits back of the ridgeline.

is a pleasant house, part of an important street.

The house was built in 1792 by Dr. Jared Redfield, a physician who lived here until his death in 1821. Sarah Todd sold the land and house in 1867 to the ReV. Lorenzo T. Bennett - who served Christ Church for about forty years. Christ Church acquired the house from his widow sometime early in the 20th century.
