7. ALTERATIONS
Addition of parish hall in rear; pinnacles on tower have been replaced. Pinnacles and pierced battlements on the tower have been removed and replaced with modern work; pinnacles were also originally on the buttresses.

8. NOTABLE FEATURES
Uncoursed ashler Central tower church; wall buttresses; large lancet windows on the tower and the main portion of the church; stained glass windows.

The massive stone construction of Christ Episcopal Church shows that it was built as an enduring monument. Corner buttresses on the tower and body add to its solidity Its central tower is pierced near its base by a lancet window with stained glass, and lancet windows with decorative mullions hold louvers on the sides of the belfry. Lancet openings also make windows along the sides of the church and entrances and windows at either side of the tower. This is important as an early and outstanding example of the Gothic Revival in New England.

The congregation of Christ Church was organized in 1744 by one of Guilford's most famous sons, Rev. Samuel Johnson, later first president of King's College, now Columbia University. stone cutters and some parishioners, The Church was constructed for a total of \$8,000. The recess chancel was added in 1872 by William Weld.

A T-shaped Parish House, designed by G. Arthur Quick, New Haven architect, was dedicated in January 1940. This building is set back from the street, between the Church and the Rectory. Further additions were made in 1953.
