Addition to rear: front entry changed to window, steps removed.

8. NOTABLE FEATURES

Dentils below the eaves; frieze; central "portico" with fluted columns and pilasters; stone belt course above the basement windows; stone quoins, keystones and springstones (on arched windows); cupola with a square base and an octagonal top with arched windows.

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

The gable and columns of the central portico, arched windows, and cupola give the Library the stately but accessible presence of the Federal Revival of the 1930s. Stone, wood and brick work well together to produce a building whose scale and ornament enhance those of its neighbors around the Green.

The Guilford Free Library was built in 1933 on land donated by Frederick C. Spencer, who had bought the property and cleared the lot in 1915. Miss Clara I. Sape had left a bequest designated for this purpose. A New Haven architect, G. Arthur Quick, who also designed the Adams School, drew up the plans which were accepted in May of 1933.
