9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

John C. Norton (1834-1894), the builder and first owner of this house, as well as the builder of at least two other houses on the street, kept daybooks of his work. In 1878, he started to build on the property, part of a new subdivision set out by John L. Seward and George P. Rolf, moved into his house with his wife and three children in May of 1879, in time for a fourth child to be born there soon after

The Norton house is a simple form embellished with front and side porches as well as a two-story bay window. A striking modern addition echoes the gable end of the original house in triangular expanses of glass.
