8. NOTABLE FEATURES

Cross gable roof, center gable projects over the front porch; overhanging eaves; spquare post ends at the end of the eaves; horizontal band of windows.

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

Built during the time when Sachem's Head was becoming a popular summer resort this two story house is built in the shingle style. The house has a cross gable roof with the center gable projecting over the front porch. Windows are grouped together to form bands with the most notable on the second floor of the projecting center portion. The corners of the porch openings are beveled and the shingle siding continues over the porch posts. Another feature of the shingle style is evident in the battered walls.

Nathan C. Dudley of North Guilford had this cottage built in the summer of 1890. The property was sold in 1907 to Erastus, Catherine B. and Lucy E. Dudley.
