7. ALTERATIONS

Aluminum/vinyl siding; external chimney and side additions; central chimney rebuilt; railing on front steps.

8. NOTABLE FEATURES

Triple window and a monumental door, enhanced by an unusually high and broad flight of front steps.

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

The house of Samuel Scranton Jr. has a balanced facade with fine details; crown moldings making small entablatures for the windows—a motif repeated in the broad Greek Revival entablature over the door The width of the three-part window carries the strong center of symmetry up to the second floor. A handsome fence with squared posts, opening to broad front steps, demonstrates the importance of fencing in the overall appearance of a building in its setting. This is a good example of the town's Federal architecture, embellished, as was so often the case, by a later door.

Correct Historic Name: Samuel and Thomas Scranton.

This house was built by brothers, Thomas and Samuel Scranton, both farmers, on land purchased from their uncle who lived at 133 State Street. The brothers lived here until Samuel's death in 1806.

The property was deeded by Thomas Scranton, Jr., on 1st October, 1867 to his three children who sold it two years later to Joel Benton (see 110 State Street).
