8. NOTABLE FEATURES

Hipped roof; large stone foundation; Palladian-like window; Federal doorway with fanlight.

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL Built around 1732 by Jonathan Starr, son of Comfort Starr who lived across the street, this square hipped roof house is unique in Guilford. The house has Federal details that were added at an early date, a pedimented doorway with fanlight, modillions, and a simple Palladian-style window. The dominant feature of this house, the hipped roof, is believed to be original as the large, solid timber in the attic area give no indication of a change in the roof line.

The house is located at a critical intersection, where the commercial zone of the Post Road crosses a fine residential street with notable historic houses to the north and the south. If these two neighborhoods are to be safeguarded, protection is needed at the corner. So far the solid form of the Starr house, with its large shady lot and white fence, is doing an important job of holding the line.
