8. NOTABLE FEATURES

An interesting combination of Greek Revival and Federal elements mixing 12/12 and 6/6 sash, and a Doric door with a Federal half-moon in the gable. If the Greek door is original this is an early example in Guilford, prototype of a long line.
9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

The house has been much enlarged by an addition on the side, and the roofline of that addition becomes part of the main cornice of the gable pediment. Set back from the road on a spacious lot, the house adds to the diversity of styles on the street.
