Dittle evidence of the 1757 house of William Starr Jr. remains. His house was a small one-and-a-half story cottage which was given a second story at some unknown date after 1838. According to David D. Dudley, the legend is that the old house was raised in the air and the new story slipped in under it. This may account for the 12/12 sash and smaller windows upstairs, and the 6/6 sash downstairs. The Greek Revival door may have been added at the same time - it would surely have been too big for the original building - In any case, the result makes an agreeable and interesting member of a fine street.
