7. ALTERATIONS

Rear addition; railing of front steps. The entry porch may perhaps be an addition of the Colonial Revival of the 1920s or '30s.

8. NOTABLE FEATURES

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

Conservative builders of Guilford carried the Greek Revival form into the last quarter of the 19th century. Details like the door placement and the cornice with returns belong squarely to the Greek Revival era. The segmental arch in the gable window shows the influence of the later Italianate style. A long stretch of distinguished picket fence and mature trees sets off the Griswold-Davis house.
