9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

Said to have been built in 1770, this house seems to have been brought up to date around 1810 by a changed roofline and the addition of several Federal Period details. A three-part window on the second floor echoes the Palladian taste, and the triangular pediment and pilasters around the doorway also point to the period. The house plays a conspicuous supporting role in its neighborhood.
