7. ALTERATIONS

The porch with its square columns and stylized capitals may possibly have been added later, but not very much later, for this type of work is familiar in New Haven by the 50s.

8. NOTABLE FEATURES

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

A wide porch and projecting cornices in high relief, casting strong shadow lines on the white walls, give this house pronounced character. The handsome fence (its square posts echoing the square columns of the porch) further strengthens the clarity of the architectural composition in its surrounding landscape. Well maintained, this is pleasing and a fine example of Guilford's rural architecture of the mid-19th century.

Russell Benton (1801-1869) son of Ambrose Benton. Russell bought and sold a number of pieces of land in this area.
