8. NOTABLE FEATURES

See #9 below. Dormers appear to be original and traditionally accompany the Dutch gambrel roof as used here. 8/8 and 8/12 sash. Flushboarding on the front -- a Federal touch. Stone basement.

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL The graceful gambrel roof sweeping out widely over the facade to form a porch is a type that evidently came to Connecticut across Long Island Sound from the Dutch settlements on Long Island, where it had been a traditional form ever since the the 17th century. It was built in considerable numbers along the Connecticut coast but is almost extinct today. This house and the David Parmelee II house (68 Water Street) remain in Guilford as two fine examples. The Stone house marks the ultimate development of the style. Putting two gambrel-roofed sections together at right angles, it makes use of changes of grade to produce a complex composition unique in the New Haven region. With its porch and balconies, tall chimneys, dormers, and stone retaining walls, this is one of Guilford's most magnificent (continued on next sheet)
