between 1238 Boston Post Road and 42 Three Mile Course. The West River is adjacent to the northeast side, residences to the southwest and a commercial plaza to the north. The Guilford Green is almost a mile to the southeast. There are evergreen trees located throughout the cemetery and some lining the west perimeter. (See Continuation Sheet)

• Other notable features of building or site (Interior and/or Exterior)

Laid out in 1818, the West Side Cemetery has many different types of gravesites and tombstones. Some of the motifs displayed are death's heads, winged cherubs, open bibles, willow trees, urns, and doves. There are several obelisks and crosses among the large monument type stones. There is also a family plot on the east side with a large stone sarcophagus for a couple (dated 1816 and 1847) surrounded by a stone wall with a staircase. (See Continuation Sheet)

• Historical or Architectural importance:

The nearby Guilford Green was the original and earliest burial ground for the town. The last burial was made there in 1818. This cemetery, established the same year when many of the markers from the Green were transferred there, was originally created under the name of "Proprietors of the Burying Ground in Guilford", sometimes referred to as "Riverside" and later known as West Side, because it was on the west side of the borough. Some of the family plots include members of the Chittenden, Baldwin, Kimberly, and Graves families, among many others.

Buildings and Surroundings Continued

A road goes around the rectangular parcel with an entrance on the southwest side and an exit on the northeast side of Three Mile Course. The southeast end of the cemetery, located farthest away from the entrance/exit is a newer section and the topography drops off with a few step like features in the landscape with gravesites on each level. On the east side, the land drops off just past the gravesites into the river valley. The rows are fairly straight and laid out north to south, facing east or west. The entrance and exit has a stone wall and pillars on the northwest perimeter adjacent to the road.

Notable Features Continued

Many of the oldest stones are leaning up again a metal railing in the middle of the property and are covered in lichen. The newer stones are on the south and west sides.
