8. NOTABLE FEATURES Overhanging eaves and rafters; large stone chimney; stone arched openings; some elongated hexagon shape panes in the dormer windows; (facade not seen - not visible from a public road)

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

Looming up from a bed of granite surrounded by water, this enormous house rises from a stone first floor to a second floor surrounded by glassed-in porches to a third floor of shingled dormers, gables, and roofs. A splendid example of seaside architecture of the grand scale of the early years of this century along the east coast. There are elements of several styles in this house: colonial revival, shingle style, and bungalow. There is a small pergola located beside the tennis court with columns and a roof angle similar to that of the main house. It has not been possible to tie the name of any architect to this large house.

The house was built by Edward Seward, one of the founders of the Sachems Head Yacht Club. He lived in this house for two years, his widow sold the property in 1919.
