9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL from the road.

Thomas Leete, son of Solomon, married Anna Norton 30 June 1773. From his father's estate, his first purchase of land, made in 1785, was augumented by his inheritance of land around his house from his father's estate in 1803 - Leete became an eccentric.
