House winterized, remodeled with additions by Frank Winder (Orr, Winder and Associates). He also designed the boathouse.

8. NOTABLE FEATURES
Steep hip roof; large stone chimneys; circular windows on the north side; patio area below the second story on the east side, supported by large stone piers.

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL Built by New Haven architect Douglas Orr for D.

Spencer Berger, a corset manufacturer in New Haven
this house shows French Provincial influences in its long hip-roofed

form. Its rough stone surface, standing in contrast to its smooth lawns, fit its site at the end of Vineyard Point, from which it has

a commanding oversight on the Sound.

D. Spencer Berger purchased property on July 17, 1923 from "the Newhall sisters" with the plan to develop a summer colony with community beach and tennis court. He built a cottage for himself on the Western shore point. This cottage burned in 1931 and was replaced by the present house. Most of the neighboring cottages were built in the mid-1920s. House has been remodeled, boathouse has been added. The stone is Leete's Island Quarry Granite.
