## 8. NOTABLE FEATURES

Boxed cornice; 12/12 sash; 8/12 sash in the gable; slightly projecting window frames; doorway with a plain frame, five pane transom and a crown moulding; stone foundation.

## 9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

If, as is now thought, this house was built in 1807 for James Leete, Jr., its style is more that of the previous century, which may explain its former identification with the Fosdick house built nearby in 1719. The central chimney, spacing of windows, and even the plain doorframe with small transom lights are all conservative features for a house built in the early years of the 19th century. House was used by the town as an alms house - 1868.
