8. NOTABLE FEATURES
Broader than many of its kin, this Greek Revival house presents a solid four-bay facade to the street. The house has a narrow frieze line and 6/6 sash. Shingle siding is not normal treatment for buildings of this style and must have been added at a later date.

This house was built as a two family house. It continues to be used as a duplex today. Frank Blatchley, and his wife Rosa resided in this house in 1896. (see also 211 Water Street).
