Notable Features

A recessed blue door entry with simple surround and crown is placed at the north end. The wing extends to the south and has two six over six hung sash windows. A skylight is built into the roof of the wing.

Historical/Architectural Importance

William N. Norton was one of the original owners of a summer cottage on Mulberry Point (807, now demolished) in 1885 in what would become a summer colony. Norton had a strong association with Mulberry Point since he worked in the fish oil industry, prominent on the point in the mid nineteenth century. He also owned a building on the Point known as the "fish hut" because it was the only remaining trace of the fish-oil works (built c.1865), originally the small quarters for a night watchman. As of 1983, Charles F. Hill owned the house.
