Notable Features

Below that is a wraparound porch, the front part enclosed and the part inset in the "L" open. The cross gable that can be seen from the front, at the north end, has one two over two window like the front façade windows.

Historical/Architectural Importance

Brown built the boatyard shop out of timbers once used in a church on the Green. Frank owned the yard until the late 1970s but it is still a thriving boatyard today.
