Rear addition; railing on front steps; rebuilt chimney; 6/6 sash on front facade.

8. NOTABLE FEATURES

Flairing eaves; 12/12 sash windows on the sides; 6/6 sash in the gable; plain board doorframe; five pane transom; high, stone foundation.

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

Curving up from the slope of the roof, the wide overhanging front eave is a distinctive feature of the David Parmelee house. The overhang, probably derived from Dutch influences, shelters double front steps that climb over a neatly laid stone foundation to a simple framed door. This small house sits close to the sidewalk.

David Parmelee I was the son of Joseph, who lived at 54 Water Street. David was born 6 September 1759. He died 26 August 1814. His son, David II (1784-1870) was a blacksmith, originally a Whig, eventually a Democrat who held many local offices.
