Chimney (rebuilt); enclosed fanlight over the front door; front steps and railing.

8. NOTABLE FEATURES

Doorway with slender pilasters (decorative capitals), and a triangular pediment with dentils.

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

The even spacing of windows and a pedimented door in the corner are distinguishing features of this Federal style house built for David Parmelee II in 1807. A rear ell of the house is thought to be an outbuilding that once belonged to Samuel Desborough, one of Guilford's founders. If so, that part would date from the middle of the 17th century.
