Arched staircase window with stained glass; two-story bay window; porch with scroll work in the gable; decorative shingles.

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

This house is a mixture of styles. The cornice returns, rectangular gable windows and three bay facade are reminiscent of the Greek Revival style that was prevalent in Guilford. The two story bay window and the arched stair window show the influences of the Italianate period. Decorative shingles and the scroll work in the gable peak and the pierced boards between the balusters on the porch are influences of the Queen Anne period.
