9 ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL The off-center chimney and doorway of this Colonial house are among the features that show a building adapted to the needs of its many inhabitants. The addition of a Greek Revival doorway to an older house is typical of Guilford. The addition at the north-end is an early modification. This house, now a shop, close to the street alongside the Green, is testimony to the changing role and continued importance of the Green in the town's history.

The house was built by Dan Collins. Later it was owned by Amos Seward, the town's second postmaster, who kept the post office

in a room here.

It was threatened by fire in 1872 when three houses to its south burned down. The house was saved by men who kept the burning wal north of the adjacent house from falling on to it. Julius Dowd had (contid. on next sheet)
