A good example of a 1920s small scale commercial building. Brick and stone detail ornament the upper part of the front. A stone mortar and pestle crown the roof line, honoring its original owner, Frank Douden, a pharmacist.

In 1926, having torn down the Woodward Tavern (formerly the Hotchkiss House dated cl800), Douden built this commercial building to house his drug store on the ground floor. Southern New England Company maintained a telephone exchange

on the second floor 1927-52.
