9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

In the basement, stone carved with the date 1828 is the justification for the early date assigned to this house, which has the proportions of a later time. The impressive Greek Revival doorway may have been a later addition to this small house at the edge of a quiet road.

In 1971, the one-room West District Durham School (1825) was moved to North Guilford and linked to this house with a breeze-way. The school house has an arched "beehive or crown" ceiling, said to have improved ventilation.
