8. NOTABLE FEATURES

Overhanging eaves; boxed cornice; 2/2 floor plan; stone foundation.

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

The steep grade to the street emphasizes the tall narrow form of this simple structure that holds two rooms on each floor. The house seems to have been built by Roswell Redfield in 1814 and transferred by him to Joseph Griffing November 1 of that same year. The ell on the west side may be older than the house; newspapers of 1803-4 were found in its attic, and originally it had a "Dutch" overhang like that of 68 Water Street before a new roof hid it.
